PRONE CLASS Beginning shooters, age 14 and younger

RECLASSIFICATION:

1. Shooter fires two scores in the next higher class for classes A, B, C, D
 Shooter fires three scores in the next higher class for classes jr MA & jr EX.

2. Shooter "jumps" one class with a single score. Moves up one class in A, B, C, D
 (B shooter fires an expert score - moves to A class)

3. Shooter "jumps" two or more classes with a single score. Moves to the class just below the fired score. (A "D" class shooter fires an "A" score - moves to "B" class)

4. For a shooter to move to jr MA or jr EX he/she must fire three scores to enter these classes.

It is hoped that this reclassification will even out the number of shooters in each class.
